PERSONAL SAFETY PRESENTATION



On the 4th of March, Year 11s at Swan Hill College listened to a presentation on personal safety by Sonya Karras, who works in hospitality and nightclubs in Melbourne. Her aim was to make sure students had "the best social life ever" whilst still being safe.

Sonya spoke about safe partying, including drink sizes, spiking, designated drivers and what to do to keep both yourself and friends safe when drinking alcohol. Also covering dangers of drink driving and strategies for managing stressful medical scenarios, Sonya captured the attention of students through a number of humorous stories recounted from other schools, and jokes about what not to do when partying and drinking. The audience was constantly involved in answering questions, and a student helped Sonya demonstrate the recovery position for when peers are in danger of vomiting or

The importance of these lessons was not missed when she shared the story of her own personal loss due to drink driving, outlining the importance of the decisions every individual makes before, during and after consuming alcohol.
